The final show of ACT 1's 2017-2018 season is upon us. *Urinetown: The Musical* opens June 1 and will run until June 9.

Urinetown is the story of a town under control of a company that regulates the bathrooms. One man decides to start a revolution to wrest control back. His determination is complicated by meeting the daughter of the company's CEO.

It is musical satire at its best.

"We are so blessed by this cast and crew, and they epitomize an ensemble level of professionalism which is going to really pay off in performance," said Artistic Director Petra Karr.

Such an excellent cast and crew has made up for all the challenges that a large musical entails.

"A lot of the challenges have fallen to Matt, our musical director. We have a very awkward space to work with at the Liberty,

so we simply can't work with the size of ensemble we would have liked. Our actors are working hard to create the powerful sounds we need, and Matt is creatively moving parts, and in some cases double-casting, to create the sounds we need." Karr said.

The Liberty space doesn't just constrain the number of actors on stage, it also provides an obstacle to the set as well.

"Set Designer Avelon Ragoonanan and Technical Director Chris Karr are challenged with creating all the acting spaces required and fitting it functionally into a very difficult space," Petra Karr said.

This will be the last show ACT 1 performs at the Liberty Theater. The 2018-2019 season will be in new locations in the Tacoma/Auburn area. Details of these new locations will be released soon.

The Barovic Family sold The Liberty Theater in the latter half of 2016. ACT 1 was originally told it could stay, and then later told it could not.

"We hoped this would be our long-term home," Karr said of the Liberty.

ACT 1 moved to the Liberty Theater two seasons ago. The industrial-garage-turned-black-box-theater that they had been working out of was renovated and so ACT 1 and others had to go. That space became apartments.

"We thought [the Liberty] was a cool space," Karr said.

New board president assumes command

The 2017-2018 season for ACT 1 was a fresh start — there was an all-new board of directors, as well as a new president.

Not long into the season, the president had to step down for health reasons and the vice president, Sarah Alexander, had to step up. But she was up to the task.

"It was a lot to take on," Alexander said, noting that the board was already in a transitional period.

With all new board members came all new ideas. No one knew anyone else, and while that allowed a certain amount of openness, the hardest part for Alexander was finding out what her fellow board members needed from her and finding "the balance of pushing the team, [but] not pushing too hard."

Alexander has a long history in theater. You may have seen her in ACT 1's A Midsummer Night's Dream as Titania. She has a degree in non-profit management and has worked with theaters before. At previous positions she rotated through all the departments, which gave her a good sense about how theaters are run and what goes on during board meetings.

Alexander said taking on the presidency of the ACT 1 board was difficult, but her new role has offered rewards, especially the close-up look at ACT 1's successes this season. It

She said she hopes to maintain these successes into the future. She said she would like to continue to see new volunteers and growing student programs and classes. Most of all, Alexander would like to keep ACT 1's voice endure in the community. She looks forward to leading and encouraging the board as ACT 1 grows through the seasons.




